Haynes, Jeanette Parker, age 84, concluded a wonderful life of serving others when she passed away May 20, at her home in North Shelby County after a brief battle with cancer.

Born the first child to Thurman and Berta Parker on July 1, 1931, in McCalla, Alabama, Jeanette, lived most of her life in the Bessemer/McCalla area. She was a member of Raimund Heights Baptist Church where she served as nursery director for over 25 years.

Known as "Mrs. Jeanette" to numerous children who grew up at Raimund Heights, Jeanette had a reputation for being a fantastic cook who always had plenty of food available at mealtime, not only for her family, but also for any of her children's friends who "hung out" at the Haynes' home. After her third child was born, Jeanette began a 35 year career in retail sales, serving (in order) at Dixie Clothing Co., Dixie Shops, and Baron's Men's Store. Despite being a working mom, Jeanette valued the importance of putting her family first. She always managed to be an immaculate house keeper while preparing full breakfasts and dinner meals that always included a meat, three or four vegetable's and dessert. Plenty of snacks were always available as well. She and her husband, Fred, also spent many fall Friday evenings working in the concession stand during McAdory High School football games.

Celebration of Life will be Monday, May 23, 2016 at 2:00 p.m. at Raimund Heights Baptist Church 233 Elrie Boulevard, Bessemer. Burial will follow at Highland Memorial Gardens. The family will receive friends Monday from

12:30 p.m. until 2:00 p.m. at the church.
